Then it will also discuss about presuppositions, about speech acts, speech events, pragmatic studies in Japanese and their comparison with pragmatics in Indonesian using examples of problems/errors in language. After attending this course, students are expected to understand the basic theories of pragmatics, deixis, speech acts, applying them in Japanese communication according to the context. The lectures use an eclectic approach, a combination of lecture techniques, question and answer, discussion, and problem solving.
