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Learning outcomes					
<p>The Japanese Language Learning Evaluation Course is a subject that must be followed by students in semester 6, which discussed about; (1) Definition of evaluation, assessment, measurement and testing; evaluation objectives and benefits; the position of evaluation in learning, (2) various types of evaluation, (3) evaluation methods, (4) test problems, (5) types and forms of tests, (6) validity and reliability, (7) standardized tests and teacher-made tests, (8) preparation, implementation, and assessment of tests, (9) <i>choukai</i> (listening) test, (10) <i>kaiwa</i> (speaking) test, (11) <i>dokkai</i> (reading) test, (12) <i>sakubun</i> (writing) test, (13) <i>moji/goi</i> (vocabulary) test, and (14) <i>bunpou</i> (grammar) test . Courses are held in the form of lectures and discussions equipped with various media including the use of laptops and LCDs.
